1. Minutes of the AGM held 16 November 2016: Approved.

#### 2. Treasurer's report

The club now has 155 full members and 9 second claim members, an increase in membership from 2016 when the club had 127 full members. Income totalling £4,302.70 has mainly come from subscription payments, Trent 5 profit of £762.70 and sales of jackets and vests. Expenditure for the year totalled £3,363.46, with main costs being England Athletics registration and affiliation, summer league registration and training courses, leaving a balance of £1,997.39 as cash in bank, with assets of 31 vests.

### 4. Road Race Secretary's report and presentation of road league trophies

There has been a record turn out on the road this year with 105 runners taking part in at least one race on the calendar.

Chris Bell is the mens Champion this year with Rob Evans 2<sup>nd</sup> and James Isherwood 3<sup>rd</sup>. The womens championship again went to Sophie Eadsforth. Chris Bexton was second and Catherine Simkins third.

## 5. Fell Race Secretary's report and presentation of fell league trophies

The Fell Race League completed two weeks ago with the toughest race on the Calendar. In total this year **34 Males** and **17 Females** members raced, an increase of **16**.

Since last year we have found the Fell Trophy hidden in a shed.

To the results, 20 Races, best out of 6 to Count.

This year by 2pts the **Men's Champion** this year is John Evans with Dan Rawson as the runner up. Third place was joint with Andrew Mothershaw and myself.

The **Women's Championship** goes again to Catherine Wilson followed closely with 2pts behind by Jackie Welburn. No other qualifiers.

**8** Males and **2** Females completed 6 of the races. I'm going to up the number of Qualifying races to **8** for next year.

We didn't score well in the **Nottinghamshire County Fell Championship** Wolf's Pitt Fell Race, results are on the Notts AAA website. George Bramell cut his finger on a post and required stitches.

Injuries, I managed to twist my ankle in June which cost me 2 months off running and is still swollen.

The First Race next year is likely to be Wolf's Pitt Fell Race in the Hope Valley 3rd week in March.

## **6. Cross Country Secretary's report**

Last winter's Cross-Country competition saw a record 38 men and 15 women battle for supremacy in the parks and fields of Nottinghamshire and the Midlands.

Beeston had 28 runners complete the Bramcote race of the East Mids league and 25 runners complete the National at Wollaton Park.

6 women and 7 men gave themselves a chance of victory in the Beeston league by completing 6 or more races.

Both competitions went down to the wire with Dan Rawson, Steve Mason, Catherine Wilson, Sophie Eadsforth and Catherine Simkins all in contention for the top spots at the National at Wollaton Park.

Dan was assured of first place in the men's but Steve could draw level on points if he were to be first Beeston runner home. He wasn't and so Dan Rawson retained the men's trophy by 3 points.

Sophie appeared to have a comfortable lead in the women's but both the Catherines could overtake her in the last race. Catherine Wilson did and so claimed the women's trophy by 5 points.

Second places went to Steve Mason and Sophie Eadsforth and third places to Richard Upward and Helen Rawson.

Special mentions must go to Catherine Simkins and Nicki Ottley de la Salle for winning the Bramcote Park and Colwick Woods rounds of the East Midlands league.

# 7. Ladies' Secretary's report

Growth in numbers of lady members has continued though is slowing, with 51 women now in the club compared to 47 last year. This represents one-third of the current membership of 155. Participation in races is also continuing to increase, 33 in the road league last year and 34 this year and even more in the cross country and fell leagues. Last year the vet ladies were 4<sup>th</sup> in the Summer League but went one further this year and secured the bronze position. Other highlights have been seeing Sonka's success in the Robin Hood and Santa Cruz marathons recently, and Sophie and Jackie winning medals as part of a Notts County cross country team in last Saturday's Midland Inter Counties race.

I'm now stepping down as Ladies Rep to take on the Club Secretary role, a job I took on in 2013, and said at the point of accepting that I saw my job, in addition to putting forward women's views to an otherwise totally male committee at that time as encouraging women to participate in the summer league races, and in particular in the two cross country leagues. This has definitely happened (though little to do with me), and I'm so pleased to see so many women enthusiastically getting covered in mud in the winter months – personally I've gone off it but wish you all the best in the next few weeks in the East Mids and North Mids races to come!

# 8. Report on Club Handicap Races

Simon Elliott was the chief organiser of the handicap races, in particular the Trent Lock challenge and took charge with many members marshalling, 31 runners took part and the winner was Lucy Grant. Helen Rawson was the handicapper for the Single Gravs, 55 runners, Michael Lyden came in first, and the handicapping was a great success. Phil Herd was the guest handicapper for the Double Gravs, 38 and this was won by Sarah Lightman. Many thanks go to the handicappers and Simon is looking for volunteers next year, John Evans will be handicapping the Single Gravs, and there is a vacancy for a guest handicapper for the Double Gravs.
